

GUIDELINES FOR




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- Share plans for the week with students and families, including learning objectives, activities, assignments and links to resources.
- Allow real-time interactions with students to deliver lessons and facilitate discussion.
- Archive lessons for students to access later.



Use an agreed communication plan to interact with students and families, respond to their messages in a timely fashion and give updates on students' progress.



- Monitor student participation in activities, assignments and assessments, and provide timely feedback on work submitted.
- Identify appropriate activities and assignments for students who need additional support or enrichment activities.



During the homeroom sessions in secondary schools, teachers should engage students in active discussions and help them to adjust to the school environment.



At primary level, small groups of students can share their thoughts and concerns.



 Class teachers should refer any students who display worrying behaviour to guidance counsellors.





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
